Responsibilities include curriculum design, collaborated on the design of new BA & BFA Programs, Head of BA Theatre Program, Head of MA Theatre Program, analyzing transcripts, creating ADPs for BA and MA students, advising BA, MA & MFA students, MA & MFA thesis committee chair/member, school committee member, faculty senate representative, chair of faculty search committee, recruiting BA/BFA/MA/MFA students, and teaching/directing BA/BFA/MA/MFA students.

- 2009, 2011,
2015 *The Hagen Approach* (grad & undergrad)
Designed and taught twice-weekly classes for third-year MFA students on the exercises from Uta Hagen's A Challenge for the Actor and Respect for Acting. The class culminated in scene work supported by selected technical challenges addressed by the exercises.
- 2010, 2015 *Screen Acting 1* (undergrad)
Designed and taught traditional sixteen week course (2015) and intensive five week course (2010) for undergraduate students on the technique and performance of screen acting. Utilizing material from different genres (e.g., night time soap, mockumentary, sitcom, science fiction, et al.) and techniques from Stanislavski, Hagen, Tony Barr and Michael Caine, students perform material written for the screen on-camera. Students learn about adjusting performance for the camera based on framing and genre. Student actors review taped work and participate in critique of work.
- 2005-2017 *Screen Acting 1 & 2* (grad)
Designed and taught twice-weekly classes for second and third-year MFA students on the technique and performance of screen acting. Utilizing material from different genres (e.g., sitcom, science fiction, period drama, et al.) and techniques from Stanislavski, Hagen, Tony Barr and Michael Caine, students perform material written for the screen on-camera. Students learn about adjusting performance for the camera based on framing and genre. Student actors review taped work and participate in critique of work. Screen Acting 2 also addresses advanced acting problems including Hagen's conditioning forces, green screen acting and Period Drama on film. In both classes, students apply script analysis techniques from Robert McKee, as well as commercial script analysis techniques from Joan See. Students perform on-camera commercials in different styles (e.g., film, sitcom, sketch comedy) and forms (e.g., slice-of-life, character spokesperson). Class taught with the support of a professional film crew.
- 2006-2017 *Text Analysis* (grad & undergrad)
Designed and implemented fifteen week course teaching undergrad and grad students analysis tools for theatre literature. Also, team taught a version of this course in conjunction with scenic/light designer David Shuhly, PhD. Students gain in their understanding of text analysis tools through practical weekly application to reading assignments from plays with supplemental reading in television and film scripts. Developed and taught online version in addition to face to face.

- 2011 *Intro to Theatre* (undergrad)
Designed and implemented fifteen week course teaching Introduction to Theatre entailing an examination of the history of the theatre, its literature, and various genres and styles of performance, as well as the artists who collaborate in realizing it for the stage. Students gain an appreciation and understanding of the theatre as an entertainment medium, a commercial entity, and an art form.
- 2010 *Fundamentals of Directing* (undergrad)
Designed and implemented fifteen week undergraduate directing course focusing on the practical components of the director as artist, leader, and collaborator; helped undergrads develop the various skills necessary to analyze a piece of drama and lead a group of collaborative artists in realizing drama on the stage, focusing on modern realistic dramatic literature through text analysis, communication of concepts, coaching and stylistic techniques.
- 2009-2016 *Scene Study* (grad)
Designed and taught twice-weekly classes for second year MFA students on the technique and performance of acting for the stage. Utilizing contemporary material, Tennessee Williams and the technique developed by the Atlantic Theatre Company, students rehearse and perform material written for the stage. A process oriented class, emphasis is on scene analysis based upon the methodology from *The Practical Handbook for the Actor*. Additional exercises from Uta Hagen's *A Challenge for the Actor* are integrated to support the process.
- 2007-2017 *Auditioning and the Business of Acting* (grad)
Designed and taught Auditioning and the Business of Acting with the objective to prepare students for videotaped auditions and job interviews in the professional theatre and film/television world. Students discuss advanced video concepts as well as apply acting technique to the audition. Utilizing Shurtleff's guide posts, students are assigned and choose material in many different genres and present it in a mock video.
- 2017 *Video Auditioning for Actors* (grad)
Designed and team taught online course with the objective to prepare students for job interviews/auditions in the professional world. Students discuss advanced business concepts as well as apply acting technique to the audition. Utilizing Shurtleff's guide posts, students are assigned cold reading material in many different genres and present it in a mock audition in both office rooms and in a theatre. Finally, students create a five-year business plan that may be revised and enhanced once they graduate. Class includes a lab to prepare a culminating showcase.
- 2006, 2008 *Actor Coaching* (grad)
Designed and implemented a weekly course for cinema and television directors, graduate level actors and undergrads to learn practical tools for coaching actors on the stage and screen using the tools of Clurman and Ball. Introduced and explained Stanislavski-based acting technique with special attention to distinguishing the difference between process and product oriented direction. Students analyze text and direct actors based on text analysis in conjunction with a personal vision. Students direct in class and outside of class with in-class coaching taped with the support of a professional film crew and reviewed in class. Students participate in critique as well as Discussion Board reflection afterward. Class includes an online discussion board.

TEACHING EXPERIENCE (continued)

- 2007 *Advanced Directing 2* (grad)
Team taught MFA Actors and MFA Actor/Directors with Gillette Elvgren, PhD. My units in this course focused on actor coaching/evaluation during the different steps of the audition process, utilizing improvisation in the audition and rehearsal process, coaching actors in rehearsal, solving problems posed by original material, and communicating the purpose/general beauty of a piece to potential backers. Additionally, I provided tools for evaluating direction.
- 2007 *Theories and Concepts of Directing* (grad)
Designed and team taught MA and MFA students with Gillette Elvgren PhD. The course is intended to provide Theatre students at the graduate level with practical tools for directing actors on a proscenium stage, arena stage and/or other venues. Working with literature from Shaw, O'Neil, Strindberg, and Lorca, students devise a central image concept, audition actors, create floorplans, block scenes, and explore the use of props to reveal character. Additionally, this class utilizes acting technique for realistic acting and improvisation to help coach actors at varying levels of development during the audition or rehearsal process with emphasis on William Ball's tools for directing. Finally, class provides opportunities for directors to guide actors while developing sketches based on proverbs.
- 2006, 2008 *Theories and Concepts of Acting* (grad)
Designed and implemented a twice-weekly course for MA students utilizing Uta Hagen's exercises, terminology from "A Practical Handbook for the Actor" and Viola Spolin's Improvisation techniques. Emphasis is placed on Stanislavski's system and the application of his theories and principles in exercises and performance presentations. The course consists of lectures, exercises, improvisation, scene work and sketch work. Students discuss advanced foundational concepts regarding acting technique and apply this technique in a process oriented environment.
- 2007 *Musical Theatre Workshop* (undergrad & grad)
Designed and team-taught Musical Theatre Workshop with a choreographer and Music Director. Students utilize Uta Hagen's acting tools to analyze a song and create a character analysis that aids in interpreting a song as a monologue or duologue. Students use these tools for an up-tempo song, a ballad, two audition pieces, a small group number (duet/trio) and a large group number. Students ultimately use one audition piece for the Spring musical audition and they perform the group number in costume for the public at the end of the semester.
- 2006 *Improvisation* (grad)
Designed syllabus, team taught and participated in class & public performances with Derek Leonidoff. Through participating in class, I was able to model improv foundational elements found in Viola Spolin's work as well as Second City, Improv Olympics and the Groundlings. Additionally, I taught improv as it is used in auditions.

Created and implemented a weekly class for directors, producers and actors emphasizing strategies for directing actors in different genres using the techniques of Stanislavski, Hagen and Robert Lewis; vocabulary for directing actors; lectures on creative, administrative and political aspects of the casting process; vocabulary specific to casting directors; administrative duties of the casting office; and script analysis based on Robert McKee's *Story*.
